We are looking in particular for researchers with a background in theoretical linguistics and cross-linguistic research.

Please also provide a CV detailing your academic education, past and current positions, publications, presentations and other professional activities. Also, provide names and e-mail addresses for two persons that may be able to send letters of reference, but do not send these letters with your application. The position is to be filled in accordance with the German *Wissenschaftszeitvertragsgesetz*. This means that we expect applicants relatively early in their career (essentially, dissertation defense not earlier than 2017, not counting parental leaves) that have a goal of further qualifying themselves (e.g., a professorship). Please make clear in your application letter that you would satisfy these requirements.
